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ABSTRACT

A growing interest in Gerontology, the scientific study of the process of growing old and old age, follows, inevitably, the accelerating demography of aging people in the 21st century, particularly in India. Life expectancy, improved sanitation, medical technology, and modern health care services, among other things, have contributed to the growth of the aged; their roles too, with the accompanying infirmities, get shifted from decision makers to those of dependents. The aged population simply cannot be viewed as a homogenous group. Hence the manifestation, consequences, health issues, psychological and social problems of the aged population of the whole country or state can't be generalized.
